



ST PAUL'S CATHOLIC PRIMARY SCHOOL SPORTS PREMIUM 2014 2015

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

St Paul's will receive £8000 plus £5 premium per pupil per annum. This funding will amount to £9070.

Purpose of funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.
